Flux is a stackable chair, available in a wide range of colours, with a cataphoretically-treated steel rod frame painted in polyester powder, making it ideal for outdoor environments.

Shaped like a drawing in thin air, the steel rods each move in an axis of unlimited directions, representing the unlimited possibilities of life.

Flux is characterized by its use of simple materials, its flexible production technique and its code of expression, which speaks of a

human flow of energy: a chair with a simple, sincere design that gives it a timeless feel.


